Background to 2016-2017 Catch Up Premium Funding

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve at least level 4 in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2). In the academic year 2016-17 schools received £500 for each pupil in year 7 who did not achieve at least level 4 in reading or maths at the end of KS2.

How we use year 7 literacy and numeracy Catch Up Premium

We commit to assessing the individual needs of each of the pupils who attract the year 7 Catch Up Premium in order to decide the best way to use the funding. We will only select programmes and approaches that we know are likely to be effective. We will carefully evaluate the impact of the funding throughout the academic year and review the selection of programmes and approaches on an annual basis, in the summer term.

Proven strategies could include:

- Individual tuition
- Intensive small-group tuition
- External programmes and services e.g. Accelerated Reading and Maths programme
- ‘Out of hours’ additional teaching

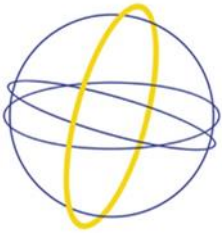

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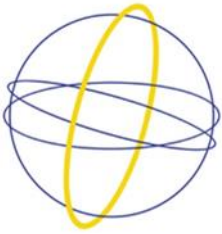
Year 7 Catch Up Premium Cohort 2016-17 Summary

There are 209 students in year 7 and 48 of those students have been identified as Catch Up Premium students. These students arrived with a KS2 standardised score in reading and/or maths of 90 or below. When students arrive without KS2 standardised scores, the school uses its own benchmark tests in reading and maths as part of a student's induction programme to determine their eligibility as a Catch Up Premium student. 23% of the 2016-17 year 7 cohort has been identified as Catch Up Premium students. The context of the identified students is as follows:
