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Alfie competes and fights in Brazilian Jiu- jitsu and Mixed Martial Arts. Alfie has competed in these tournaments since the age of 9, he has a strong dedication to the gym and trains 5 nights a week for 3 hours a day. He fights out of Stafford Fight Factory for his MMA, boxing and kick-boxing and for his BJJ he fights out of Gracie Bara Stafford.

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Age: 14 Brazilian Jiu-Jitzu & Mixed Martial Arts

Alfie has been active with his dedication to this sport since the age of 4, between the ages 4-6 Alfie did kickboxing where he found his passion for this career. From the ages 6-8 Alfie wanted a change and went to Tae-Kwando where he became World Champion at the age of 7. Alfie then heard about MMA and wanted to try it out. Little did he know he would find a love and passion for this sport and has planned to one day become UFC Champion.

Alfie has got 27 Gold medals, 11 Silver medals and 9 Bronze medals. These medals Alfie had competed for within 2 years (not including lockdown), and was invited to fight for a title in London against the best of the best in his categories. Alfie won the match in 1 minute 22 seconds via armbar. Alfie is very well known within the BJJ and MMA industry from people all over the UK. Alfie is competing almost every weekend, and he went to a competition one weekend and got invited to train with the England Youth MMA Squad, not knowing that it was a trial to become part of the squad.

Alfie's biggest achievement would be making it into the England Youth MMA Squad, Alfie was over the moon to find out he was in the England squad and to be representing England in the 4-nations. Since starting MMA he has always wished to be in the England Youth Squad as it is a good step to being in the UFC. Alfie can't wait to compete and represent England in the 4-nations in July. He has already achieved so much in his career, he has got 4 sponsors so far who help him out in many different ways. 1 of his sponsors are a BJJ clothing brand who provide Alfie with custom clothing items for when he competes, he then has a sponsor who provides him with his meal preparations so he has got the correct nutrients he needs to aid performance. One of Alfie's sponsors are really supportive with what he does, they provide him with pedal bikes so that Alfie can go on his bike to allow him keep fit and active when not at the gym training, they also go and support him when he competes and fights.
